The inaugural session was led by Prof. (Dr.) Raghuvir Singh, Vice Chancellor of K.R. Mangalam University, who set the tone for the event with his insightful address. He emphasized the need for adopting a “360-degree perspective” when tackling the complex and interconnected issues of sustainability. Prof. Singh highlighted that solutions to today’s pressing global problems require a holistic, interdisciplinary approach that bridges traditional knowledge with cutting-edge scientific research. He also underscored the importance of fostering innovation and collaboration across different fields to create meaningful, sustainable change.

The objectives of the conference closely aligned with key Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). SDG 4.4 focuses on enhancing relevant skills for employment, decent jobs, and entrepreneurship, encouraging individuals to be better equipped for the demands of a changing world. SDG 11.4 emphasizes the protection and safeguarding of the world's cultural and natural heritage, a principle deeply embedded in the integration of Indian Knowledge Systems. Meanwhile, SDG 17.8 highlights the significance of strengthening global partnerships, particularly through improving access to technology and promoting knowledge sharing, especially among developing nations. Together, these SDGs illustrate the conference’s commitment to fostering a more sustainable, inclusive, and innovative future. By blending ancient wisdom with contemporary research, the event sought to build bridges between the past and the future, creating pathways for collective progress on a global scale.

**Address of the Invited Speakers: Day 1, Venue:** K. R. Mangalam University, Gurugram

The conference featured compelling keynote addresses from distinguished scholars, each offering unique perspectives on the intersection of sustainability, indigenous knowledge, and ethical communication.

**Prof. William L. Gannon, University of New Mexico** delivered an insightful address emphasizing the critical need for cross-border academic collaborations. He pointed out that in today's increasingly interconnected world, challenges such as sustainability cannot be effectively tackled in isolation. Prof. Gannon argued that knowledge frameworks must transcend geographical, cultural, and political boundaries to foster a truly global exchange of ideas and innovations. He highlighted that the collective sharing of research, resources, and expertise among nations is essential for developing comprehensive solutions to the complex issues confronting humanity. By promoting collaborative knowledge networks, he suggested, the global academic community can make significant strides toward achieving sustainable development goals.

**Prof. F.B. Khan Founder Professor – DDI and Professor - CMMS, Jamia Hamdard University, Delhi** focused his keynote on the vital role of indigenous knowledge systems in modern sustainability practices. He underscored the richness and relevance of traditional wisdom, particularly in areas such as agriculture, healthcare, and environmental conservation.

Prof. Khan advocated for the integration of indigenous knowledge with scientific research, arguing that such a synthesis can lead to more resilient and locally adapted solutions.

He stressed that indigenous communities possess centuries-old insights into living sustainably within their environments, and modern science stands to benefit greatly from these traditional practices. Recognizing and valuing the contributions of local communities, he suggested, is key to crafting sustainable models that are both innovative and respectful of cultural heritage.

**(Dr.) K G Suresh, Former VC, MCU, Bhopal; Former DG, IIMC, New Delhi** addressed the ethical dimensions of journalism, bringing attention to the media's critical role in shaping public discourse on sustainability. He emphasized that responsible and ethical storytelling is fundamental to raising awareness, influencing public opinion, and mobilizing action. Dr. Suresh warned that without adherence to ethical principles, journalism risks spreading misinformation or fostering apathy. He advocated for journalism that informs, educates, and empowers citizens, highlighting the necessity of truthful reporting to drive societal engagement with sustainability issues. Ethical journalism, he concluded, serves not just to inform, but also to inspire communities to participate actively in building a sustainable future.

He emphasized the importance of equipping students with the tools to analyze, evaluate, and interpret media content in today's information-driven world. Prof. Saxena discussed how media education can cultivate a deeper understanding of societal issues and encourage students to approach information critically. By focusing on critical thought, he highlighted that media education plays a central role in empowering individuals to engage meaningfully with the world around them.

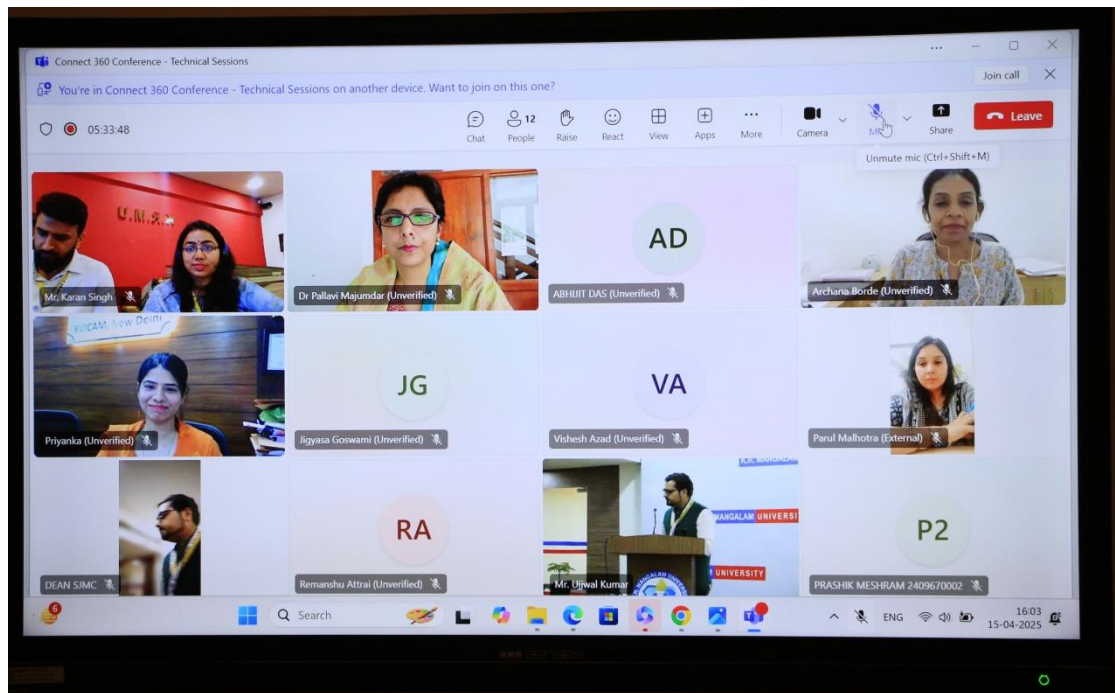

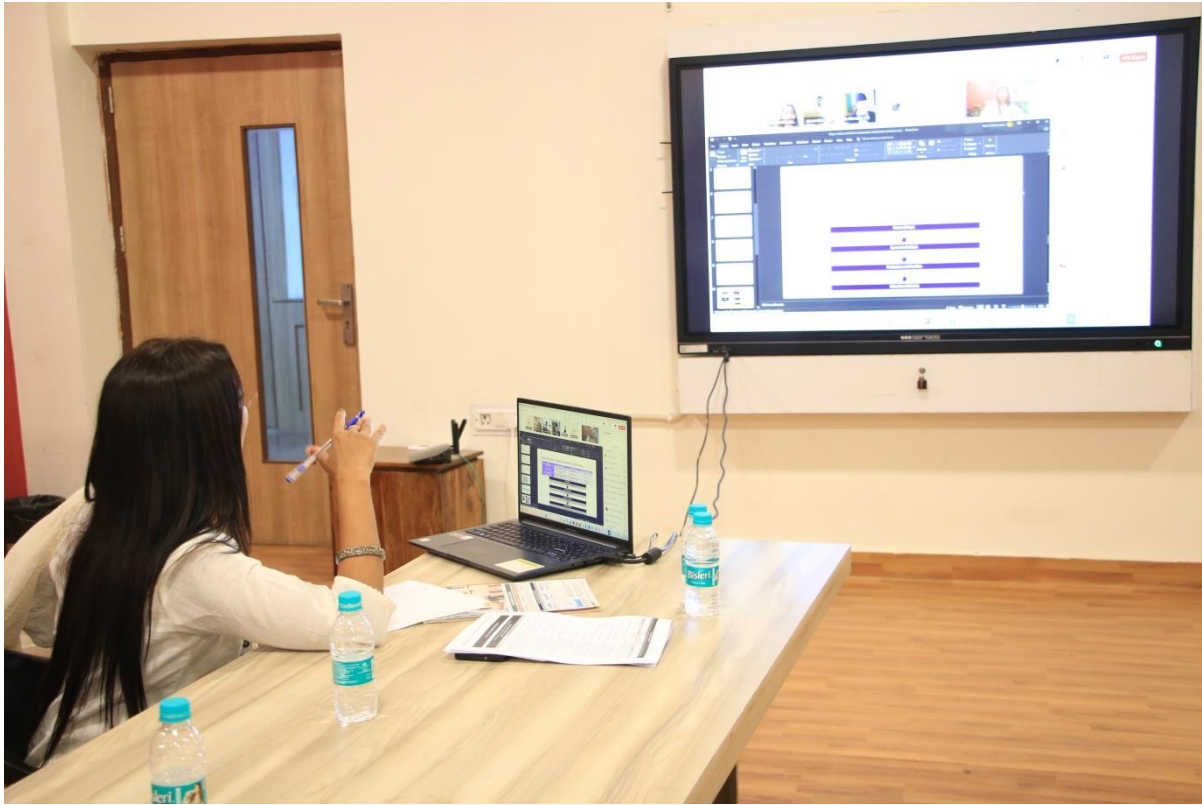

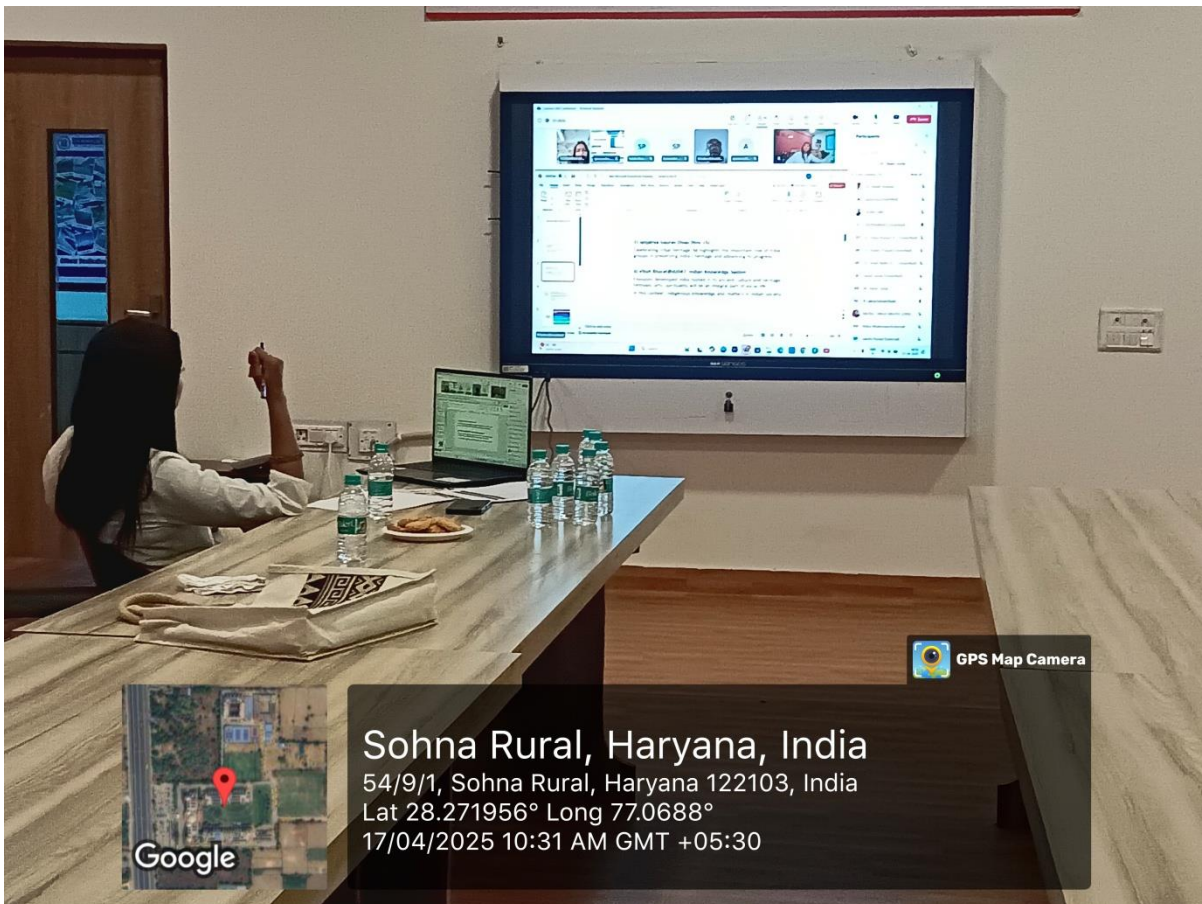
