# LEGAL AWARENESS CAMP ON MOBILE LEGAL AID THROUGH NYAY BANDHU APPLICATION: 6TH AND 7TH FEBRUARY 2025

In a significant step toward strengthening access to justice through technology, a two-day Legal Awareness Camp was organized on 6th and 7th February 2025 focusing on the Nyaya Bandhu (Pro Bono Legal Services) mobile application. The camp aimed at spreading awareness about the Government of India's innovative digital platform designed to connect citizens in need of legal assistance with pro bono advocates across the country. The camp was conducted by faculty members and law student volunteers who demonstrated the functionality, benefits, and registration process of the Nyaya Bandhu mobile application. The primary objective was to empower the community with knowledge of how to seek legal help remotely and effectively, especially in rural and underserved areas.

#### Key features of the camp included:

Live demonstrations of the Nyay Bandhu app's interface and registration process.

- One-on-one assistance to participants in downloading and navigating the app.
- Awareness sessions on how pro bono legal services work and who can avail them.
- Interactive discussions on legal rights, digital legal literacy, and government schemes related to free legal aid.

The camp saw active participation from local residents, students, women, senior citizens, and self-help groups, many of whom expressed appreciation for the initiative and showed interest in availing the services of the app. It also served as a practical learning opportunity for law students to engage in community legal education and digital inclusion efforts. The initiative reflects the institution's continuous endeavor to bridge the digital divide in legal aid delivery and promote inclusive justice by leveraging technology.

Judging was based on parameters such as listening skills, clarity of communication, legal knowledge, empathy,
